



Dear Max,
I often hear people referring to the height of a horse in the measurement of "hands."
What does that mean?

Dear Paul The "hand" is a unit of measurement that originated from the width of a man's hand. It was later standardized to 4 inches in length. Horses are measured from the base of their front feet to the top of their withers. For example, if you have a horse that is 60 inches tall it is equal to 15 hands high or 15hh.

I am very pleased to be asked to tell you about my experience at Pride Stables. I have spent a lot of time at Pride Stables over the last few years. Therapeutic horseback riding is an amazing experience!

I love the freedom of riding and I love to be around the horses who seem able to understand how I am feeling. I really prefer riding in the warmer weather—when I don't need mittens or a coat. Sometimes they feel like they just get in the way.

The volunteers who walk beside me are great! I really appreciate that they talk to me and not at me. I am not able to hold the reigns or to grab things, so I only use my thigh and core muscles to stay up on the horse. Everyone always comments on how well I can keep my balance without using my hands.

When we trot—and I LOVE to trot (the faster the better) Ashley has to hold on to my leg and run beside me. I feel very safe at Pride. To have Pride Stables means I have somewhere to go on a regular basis where I know that I belong.

Stephanie had a full and happy life. Besides her day program, she participated in speech therapy, music therapy, Weekend Social Club and the Waterloo Down Syndrome Society Buddy Choir and Pizza Pals.

Just 4 days before she died, Stephanie had a wonderful birthday party with 20 of her close friends and family. She will be remembered for the special way she touched the hearts of everyone she met.
