

#### **Trouble's Tidbits**

In a herd of horses, one gender is not always dominant of another; for example, a female may rank higher than a male in some cases, and a male may rank higher than a female in other cases. The remainder of the herd falls into rank just as an army with a top horse and the lowest ranking. This hierarchy of power effects almost everything the herd does such as who is allowed to eat first at meal time. Any time a new horse is added to an already established herd, a new order of hierarchy must be determined between the horses. 



Do you know which horses are at the top of the two herds at Pride Stables?

In the back or "pony" field Tiki is the dominant female and a protector of her herd.

In the side or "horse" field there are two handsome boys who share this title, Billy and Remington.
