
# Special Notes from Riders

A gaited horse moves each leg independently so there is always one foot on the ground.

Because of this, they are very smooth to ride.

Gaited horses include: the Tennessee Walker the Walkaloosa (isn't that a fun name!?) and the Paso Fino.
