
What is The Great Canadian Giving Challenge? It is a National public contest to benefit any registered Canadian charity. Every \$1 donated to Pride Sta-

When my son Hayden was 6 years old we inquired about the therapeutic horse riding program at Pride Stables. It was suggested by his kinesiologist as good way and fun way for Hayden to improve his low body tone. Fast forward 20 years later and Hayden still attends his regular Saturday morning session. Growing up there were many things in life he was resistant to try as are many autistic individuals due to sensory issues, but thankfully riding his favourite horse on Saturday mornings was not one of them. This proved to be a win win for us as it gave Hayden something fun to do while working to strengthen his body. Hayden also was able to, with support, attend a week long fun filled summer riding camp several summers in a row which he thoroughly enjoyed. Given that adults with developmental disabilities at times are limited to program availability and choice for something that is a good fit for the individual, we are thankful that Pride Stables fills that much needed gap for our son. We know that animals at times can connect with people in a way that human beings cannot and I believe that for Hayden that this has held true with the horses over the years at Pride Stables.

Sara has been riding at Pride Stables for the past 8 years. We are very fortunate to have such a wonderful facility dedicated to helping individuals with special needs in our region.


Sara has Cri-du-Chat, which is a genetic disorder that, among other things, results in low muscle tone/strength. She started riding at Pride Stables at age 4 through Kidsability. We immediately noticed a huge improvement in her core muscle strength and balance. We have since enrolled Sara at Pride Stables for every fall and spring session. She is now 11 years old. She is completely independently mobile and active, and we attribute much of her success to the riding program at Pride Stables.

The connection Sara has developed with Jen, who runs her program, and her ponies is evident in her smiles and laughter every time she rides. It is such a joyful (and therapeutic) experience!


My name is Roseanne Hulbert. I have been volunteering with Pride Stables since I retired four years ago.

I had no experience with horses prior to joining the volunteer team; however I did have experience with people. It was here that I found I would indeed be working with the horses, either as a lead or side walker. Jen instructed us how to brush the horses and clean the hooves and put on the tack. My first rider was a young boy about six years of age. I was partnered with another volunteer, Maggie. Percy, a pony, was our assigned horse. The young boy could not have been more delightful. He was non verbal, however it was obvious by his expressions he enjoyed the experience. I knew then I had made the right decision to volunteer my time with this unique service.

I have since worked with both adult and children riders. Each rider and horse has their own story and personality. I enjoy every moment.

I can certainly say the days volunteering in the barn are the best days of my week. There is never a day I leave Pride Stables without a smile, feeling I have gained more than I have given.
